OPENREACH

As you will see and hear Openreach are busy installing the cables for our upgraded fibre broadband around the village. However, scammers are afoot too. Residents could receive calls from someone who states that they are from BT and that they are doing work in the area to improve broadband speeds. They are asking for access to personal computers so they can check current speeds, however once they have access, they gain control of other confidential information on the computers this could include banking and personal details. Openreach will NEVER call themselves BT! NEVER ALLOW PEOPLE ACCESS TO YOUR COMPUTERS REMOTELY.

DOGS

We would like to repeat the request that all dogs are kept out of the 2 village parks, even in the dark, as there has been a recent incident where an off-lead dog attacked another small dog and owner in the play park. New larger signs have been erected on all gates. The hall's CCTV captured this event, and the behaviour of the attacking dog's owner was very intimidating and frightening for all concerned. All dogs should be kept on their leads if they are in in public areas and likely to be met by others. Dogs are unpredictable and owners should have the control of them. Please remember **NO DOGS IN PARKS!**

HEDGES

SBC have informed the PC that owing to a rise in complaints, they intend to carry out a hedge survey as residents have noticed many hedges encroaching and overlapping onto pavements which can be dangerous. All hedges should be in line with the original width of the pavement and your property boundary. Please check and cut back your hedges/trees accordingly before SBC issue enforcement letters mandating this.

PUMP LANE

*THINK BEFORE YOU PARK **

Pump Lane has now been freshly painted so all double yellow lines exist on kerbs and on the roadside to prevent parking blocking the route of large vehicles. After another busy Sunday afternoon in September, the hirers of the hall had to be reminded not to park on Pump Lane or drive the wrong way down the one-way section. The new village car park has been provided as overspill and is clearly marked from the hall. It is often left empty when cars are parked on Forest and Pump Lane instead. All hirers do have their conditions of hire listed with necessary parking maps and pictures to accompany them. If you ever see unsociable parking, anywhere, please report it to SBC enforcement team by calling: 01642 528439 or email on civic.enforcement@stockton.gov.uk. Fixed penalties can be given for all inconsiderate parking and especially on pavements where it is considered a safety hazard. An enforcement officer can ask for the vehicle to be removed, or a Police Officer can issue a fixed penalty notice.

Safety - A horse and rider with no Hi-Viz gear on were seen walking down Pump Lane the wrong way too and were very lucky not to be hit by a car. Fortunately, the owners were on the pavement at the time and the horse did not spook. It was impossible to be seen as the sun was setting and the driver only saw the lower half of the horse once he was very close. Please dress to be seen as it's not always the driver's fault.

St Martin's Green

- The footpaths are being used by people walking around St Martin's Green, but please, <u>NO</u> horses on the St Martin's Green's pathways. They are footpaths and not bridleways and we request that no horses be ridden across the grass also. Please respect the public areas otherwise it will erode our walkways and grassy areas.
- The builder, Story Homes, are due to leave the St Martin's Green site soon, and their roads will be tarmacked. Please note the temporary public right of way (PRoW) hardcore footpath laid around the perimeter of old St Martin's field, is now redundant given the original PRoW has been reinstated to provide the straight through connection to the field, popular with dog walkers.
- The entrance to the site from St martins Way is due to receive a new fence and the unsightly weeds there better managed. In the next few weeks Story will conduct a full site walk around with the landscape contractor to identify and finish off any landscaping snagging issues.
- Story's have ordered six benches to be installed adjacent to the footpath. 4 are to be installed at the front of the development on the paths around the SuDS and play area with a further two along the path running along the north side,
- The park dog bin will be re-installed near the new car park.
- Following a further site visit recently, it was confirmed that Story's will proceed with the remedial action to make good/replace where necessary the stair links to the footpath, including any timber edge failures, and will repair/replace the areas of the footpath that require re-dressing. This will be with the same whin-dust material that is currently used on the footpath, "in line with the approved planning permission." This is **not** ideal and something we do keep pressing with SBC.
- The Parish Council have bought and provided another village noticeboard to enable us to keep all Saint Martin's Green residents aware of what village activities are taking place within the village. Story's will kindly install this near the entrance to the estate on Carr Lane.
- The dog bin from the new park will be moved to a more suitable area near the car park too.
- We would like to congratulate our Parish Councillor, Neil Clement, a resident on St Martin's Green, who has recently accepted the role of Vice-Chair to the Parish Council, he will passionately represent residents from St Martin's Green and champion a resident's greenspace association to ensure that all residents have a voice and get heard. We thank Damian Hadfield for his contribution to this role and who is only stepping down due to work commitments he will still remain as a Parish Counsellor.

A67 SPEED LIMIT

Please be aware that Kirklevington Parish Council and SBC have now installed A REDUCED SPEED LIMIT of 40mph between The Crown, through to the Crossroads (Shell) roundabout - this is **LIVE NOW**. We are also working hard on reducing the speed limit outside The Crown to 30mph to help reduce the number of accidents entering the village. Please observe the speed limit as enforcement will be visiting the area soon.
